P.K.M. College of Education, Madampam is committed to provide distinctive learning environment and skills ,for understanding of self and others ,to learn to solve personal and social problems and continually improving the overall performance for creative and cohesive group functioning in a global scenario. The process of curriculum transaction is the mile stone of the success of any educational programme. The institution focuses on developing new paradigm and inculcating national values for wholistic development of students. The pedagogy provides ample opportunities for students to develop into trained and competent professionals by keeping abreast of the ever changing technologies. The traditional class room teaching is supplemented by regular tests, tutorials, group discussions, appropriate lab work, workshops, projects, field visits etc. Curriculum transaction incorporates decisions about the content and effective planning for providing learning experiences to it's learners. The class room environment is congenial and makes learning proactive and the students learn a sense of team spirit, responsibility and professional integrity. It helps in building healthy student -faculty bond which develops students to their fullest potential and harnesses the best. The college adopts numerous policies for bridging the gap of the enrolled "weak" students to enable them to cope with the programme of their choices as well as promote ,reward and fecilitate advanced learners. This includes mentorship, tutorials, remedial teaching etc.

The College has a well organized system for curriculum delivery and documentation. Academic planning is done before the start of the academic year . Distribution of work load and preparation of time table is made in accordance with the academic calendar as per the UGC and NCTE norms.. The college has an annual plan, departmental plan along with teaching plan ,lesson plan, course plan, work diary, log book (college, department, faculty and class vise),work arrangement diary and hand book .The curriculum and syllabus is made available to students in the beginning itself. Along with the syllabus, the activities for realizing the local and global objectives are included in the co-curricular activities. The college follows a structured teaching plan. For every core subjects ,optional subjects and electives faculty members are encouraged to develop smart measures to improve the quality of instruction. The college strictly follows the work load for the faculty members as per the UGC and N.C.T.E .norms. The curriculum of all programmes have been designed with to provide a wholistic education ensuring the all round optimum development of the learner. As part of the intramural programmes student community is grouped into four houses and the captain and vice captain are selected from each house to inculcate effective leadership values and skills in the prospective teachers. Programmes in literary, arts , sports and various competitions are arranged among these four different houses. As the college is affiliated to the Kannur University, the process of revision and updating of the curriculum is always the responsibility of the affiliating university .Other than lectures, interactive sessions and discussions, student led seminars, workshops and pedagogic activities , debates ,quiz competitions, extension lectures by experts from various fields are included. Conceptual development is thus a continuous process of developing and enriching connections and acquiring new layers of meaning.

Feedback Obtained
The College listens actively ,takes time to analyze and think of the best possible solution to perform better. The feedback is collected through well

structured questionnaire, interactions and interviews and through systematic observation and inferences. Such feedbacks obtained after the specific period is discussed in the Staff council meetings, Staff Association Meetings, P.T.A. Meetings, Management meetings appropriately and remediation is made accordingly. Feedbacks are usually collected after the mid-semester examination, after the conduct of extra-curricular and organizational activities and whether the objectives are realized or not are discussed. All the different dimensions are brought to closer observation and steps for maintaining the positive aspects and minimizing the negative aspects are meticulously thought of. Open discussions periodically is also initiated so that in a very democratic way the intensions and outcome are analyzed. The feedback on academic dimensions such as handling classes, coverage of syllabus, strategies used, extension utilized, references provided etc are subjected to feedback. Administrative dimensions are also subjected to closer analysis and if necessary, measures are taken for smooth functioning. Suggestions and recommendations from various dimensions are entertained and positive changes are brought about after sufficient discussion. There are various clubs and committees functioning for the all-round development of the learners. Each committee conducts a periodic evaluation and submits their report to the Principal. After each programme a feedback is taken and discussed in the staff council and recommendations are made for betterment. In our college structured feedback is received from the following stakeholders: Students, Teachers, Alumni, Parents and from Practice teaching schools. At the end of the course the students are given opportunity to assess the infrastructure facilities of the college in a manual form. The analysis by the students are carefully studied by the Principal along with the staff members, and needy things if any, to be discussed with the management and the shortcomings if any will be rectified accordingly. After each Mid-Semester and Model examinations appropriate feedback is given to the students by the concerned faculty. The faculty members share the examination result to the examination committee and the convener of the committee gives an overall picture to the Principal. Alumni provides opportunity for the students to keep in contact with the institution and participate wholeheartedly in the effective functioning of the College. In each and every special programme of the college alumni representative is given due regard. Alumni feedback is collected every year in the Alumni Meet, on second Saturday of January. Their suggestions were incorporated in the smooth functioning of the College. They gave academic support to enhance the knowledge and skills of our student teachers. They lead many training programmes and personality development sessions organized by the College. Periodic evaluation and comments collected from all the stakeholders are considered with due regard and respect for future planning. The feedback obtained from the practice teaching schools are properly studied and measures are taken appropriately. On the basis of the feedback obtained, appropriate changes and improvements are made in curriculum transaction and co-curricular activities as per the expectations of stakeholders.

Mentoring system is implemented in the college. Total student strength of the college is 100. Among them 12-13 students are assigned to a faculty member who act as their mentor. Mentor always interact with the students and monitor their academic performance and helps to solve the problems came across during their course of study. Our student mentoring system is very active. We conduct mentoring system in group wise and individual wise and also provide proper guidance to them. Our mentoring system supports, motivates and improves academic performance to become an experienced, energetic and efficient teachers. Mentors council the students regarding their performance and schedule additional or remedial classes. Institution's mentoring system was in three levels. In the first level student's academic and personal issues of concern are well looked after by the mentor. In the next level the academic issues and problems are discussed by the class teacher and find solutions with that. In the third level the mentor, class teacher and Principals discusses the issues and find solutions for the issues. The students are given guidance for career besides academic issues. A special arrangement is also made available for students to solve their learning difficulties. One hour is allotted is timetable for mentoring in every week. The mentor is also responsible to provide counselling to the students and provide guidance regarding personal and academic issues. The mentor keeps track on their improvements and counsels them accordingly. The role of the mentor is to nurture the students and guide them for any issues they are coming across. Students with personal/family problems are given counselling by experienced counsellors. The students who are poor in academic performance or who scores less marks in examinations are properly guided by their mentor. They were also supported by the subject teachers. The teachers always give remedial lecturers to the academically poor students and supported and guided both in curricular and co-curricular activities. The mentor discusses the problems with the students individually and supports them in all the possible ways to enrich their academic performance. The mentors always check their attendance, marks in mid semester exam, model exams and University exams. The mentor also evaluate the all round performance of the student in the college.

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2.5.2 – Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

The institution has an examination committee under the charge of a faculty assisted by office staff. The examination committee conducts all internal exams within the college. The examination committee convener look after all the examination related matter in the college and act as the exam superintendent of the college. The committee is responsible for setting timetable, listing the invigilation duties for internal and other exams, setting question papers, declaration of the results of the college level exams etc. After evaluation the answerer papers are shown to the students and they get the freedom to express their grievances. As a teacher training institutions we consider both scholastic and co-scholastic area for evaluation. We consider all skills of the students and this focus on all round development of the students. We conduct mid semester and model examinations for each semesters and analyze the results and provide them remedial coaching. After publishing University examinations results the examination committee analyze and evaluate the results and share our findings with students. We are following certain criteria for internal evaluation. We allotted weightage for assignment, tasks and other academic activities. Marks allotted for attendance also. Due wieghtage was given for college level examinations. Rubrics were prepared for evaluating their teaching competencies. All the teachers observe the students continuously for unbiased

evaluation.

Before the starting of every academic year a Governing Body meeting was held in which Principal and representatives of the college presents the academic plan and annual budget. We finalise our academic plan and budget after getting a sanction from the Governing body. According to the academic budget, the academic activities are sanctioned. Accordingly the calendar and documentation committee plan the one year programmes. The calendar and documentation committee finalize the academic and extension activities. College academic calendar is designed considering all events in accordance with the University academic calendar. The planning which includes the academic activities, extracurricular activities, commencement and closing date of internal exams, Day observances, college festivals etc. Curricular and extracurricular activity dates, workshop dates etc were also included in the calendar. The academic calendar of the college has two sections. The first section includes profile of the college, vision, mission, objectives, management, governing body, staff list, structure of the B.Ed. course, scheme of examination, college rules regulations, fee structure, co-scholastic activities student support services, IQAC associations, details of clubs, staff in charge etc. The second section includes the academic calendar and details of programme and activities of each month. The calendar starts with June 1st the beginning of the academic year and ends with March 31st with the closing of the academic year.
