

PKM College of Education, Madampam, Kannur is a Christian Minority educational institution. The College was established in 1995 as a self-financing institution and was converted in to an aided college in 1997. It is affiliated to Kannur University and recognized by NCTE and UGC under 2(f) & 12(B) category. This temple of learning is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and named after Prof. Joseph Kandoth, who was an educational visionary, social reformer and a zealous missionary. He initiated the historical migration of Knanaya Catholic Community which in turn changed the social and economic history of Malabar. P.K.M college of education is a temple of learning with difference among the scores of educational institutions in Kerala. The institution is run by the Arch Diocese of Kottayam, belonging to the Knanaya Catholic Community and has invariable relevance as a training institution moulding the prospective teachers for the community in particular and society at large. The college aims to spell out the darkness of ignorance and illiteracy and radiate the glow of enlightment. The mission of the college is "To Nurture the Holistic Development of Prospective Teachers for a just and Humane Society."

At present H.E. Mar. Mathew Moolakkat, Arch Bishop of Kottayam Diocese is the patron and H.E. Mar. Joseph Pandarasseril, the Auxiliary Bishop is the Manager. The college is accredited by NAAC with A grade (4-point scale), in the second cycle also.

College Campus and Infrastructure.

The college has a serene environment located in the highlands of Malabar with a picturesque scenery near Thumpeny shrine on the eastern side of the Taliparamba-Iritty State Highway. The College comes under the jurisdiction of Sreekandapuram Municipality area. We have an elevated campus spread over 5 acres of pollution free and natural environment.

The infrastructure of the college comprises well equipped Classrooms, Library and Laboratories like psychology lab, Language lab, Computer lab, Network resource centre etc. Auditorium, Seminar Hall, General class room, Store, Cafeteria, outdoor and indoor games facilities are also available in the college. The entire energy need of the college is met from the solar power unit.

Hostel Facilities (Visitation Convent Hostel)

We have ladies hostel run by the college with a maximum capacity of accommodating 100 students. The visitation convent hostel is near to the college campus.

1. General Information: The Batchelor of Education (B.Ed) course of Kannur university is a professional course that prepare teachers for upper primary or middle level, secondary level and senior secondary level.

2. Course Outcomes

In higher education, student performance and learning outcomes reflect what students acquire upon successfully completing a course or program. These outcomes are the intended goals of the program. Institutions make systematic efforts to monitor and communicate students' progress throughout their studies. Collecting and analyzing student feedback helps overcome obstacles in achieving the institution's vision and mission.

The Bachelor of Education program shapes efficient, professionally competent, morally upright and socially committed teachers. Teachers This programme transforms and equips student teachers with diverse teaching skills and competencies to address contemporary societal issues. The program includes core courses, pedagogic courses, electives, and EPC courses, contributing capable educators to society.

This pre-service teacher education program, the crucial early phase in developing new teachers, should provide a competency profile relevant, coherent, and of high quality. Program and course outcomes include professionally competent, reflective, and versatile teachers with social sensitivity, content knowledge, ICT skills, creativity, and diverse teaching methods.

Core courses

Core courses, including papers like Psychology of Childhood & Growing up, Contemporary India & Education, Language Across the Curriculum, and more, delve into the background for historical, philosophical, sociological, and psychological foundations of education. These courses equip students to comprehend the multifaceted aspects of education effectively.

Pedagogic courses

There are four pedagogic courses, including Understanding Discipline and Subject, Pedagogy of School Subject Part I, Assessment for Learning, and Pedagogy of School Subject Part II. These courses provide comprehensive knowledge of teaching, offering both theoretical and practical insights. Additionally, there are EPC (Enhancing Professional Competency) courses, such as Reading and Reflecting on Texts, Drama and Art in Education, Critical Understanding of ICT, and Understanding the Self. These courses help to nurture diverse skills among future educators.

Elective courses

Students select one elective from five options: Guidance and Counseling, Health and Physical Education, Peace Education, Environmental Education, or Additional Pedagogy. These electives have proven effective in shaping competent educators. Health and physical education offer theoretical and practical insights on health, yoga, and first aid, promoting overall well-being, a vital educational component.

EPC Courses:

The Enhancing Professional Competency (EPC) courses in the B.Ed program focus on honing the practical skills and competencies of future educators. These courses encompass diverse areas such as reading and teaching texts, drama and art in education, critical understanding of ICT, and self-awareness. EPC courses empower teachers with a well-rounded skill set to excel in their profession.

3. Strength of Students: 50 students (1 unit) in six optional subjects.

^{*}Management has the right to change the strength of students in each optional class according to the directions/guidelines given by the University.

5. Eligibility for B.Ed. admission

Eligibility for Admission and norms for admission to B.Ed Degree programme shall be according to the rules framed by the Government/ Kannur University from time to time.

(i) General

- (a) Candidates seeking admission to the B.Ed course should have passed B.A/B.Sc Degree examination (under the 10+2+3 pattern) with one main/core subject and two subsidiary/complementary course from this University or any other University recognized by this university as equivalent thereto.
- (b) Candidates who have passed their qualifying Examination from Universities outside Kerala should submit Eligibility/Equivalence Certificate stating that their qualifying examination is recognized by this University, for seeking admission to B.Ed degree course in a particular optional subject in a stream as applicable, along with their application.
- (c) Double or triple main candidates of other Universities will be considered for admission only if they furnish the copies of the Equivalence/Eligibility certificate from Kannur University stating that the qualifying examination is recognized for seeking admission to B.Ed Degree course in a particular optional subject. Equal weightage is given to Single main, Double main and Triple main Degree holders.

- (d). The minimum requirement of marks for admission to B.Ed. Course is 50% or equivalent CGPA (No rounding off of the percentage of marks to the nearest whole number is permitted) in Bachelor's Degree (Science/ Arts subjects) for part I+II+III together (Common, Core, Complimentary and Open Courses) or Part III (Core and Complimentary Courses) alone with 50% or equivalent CGPA in MA/ M.Sc. with usual relaxation for the eligible categories as per University/ Government /NCTE Norms.
- (e) Candidates belonging to SC/ST and natives of Lakshadweep, aided or government teachers with three years regular service need to secure a pass in the Degree Examination. The candidates belonging to SEBC will be given a relaxation belonging to the OEC will be given a relaxation 5% from the prescribed minimum marks. Blind candidates who have more than 40% disability will be given relaxation of 5% from the prescribed minimum marks. Candidates should be Physically fit and mentally sound. Deaf/Dumb candidates are not eligible. However blind candidates will eligible for admission to courses other than Science optional.

(ii) For Language Optional

- (a) **English:** BA Degree with Language and Literature/Functional English /Communicative English with 50% marks or equivalent CGPA/GPA in Part I+II+III together(Common, Core, Complementary and Open Courses) or part III (Core and Complimentary courses) alone or 50% marks in MA English Language and Literature/ Functional English/ Communicative English or BA/B.Sc. with 50% marks or equivalent CGPA/ GPA for Part I English/Common Course 1(English).
- (b) **Malayalam:** BA Degree with Malayalam Language and literature with 50% marks or equivalent CGPA/GPA in part I+II+III together (Common, Core, Complimentary and Open Courses) or part III (Core and Complimentary courses) alone or 50% marks in MA Malayalam Language and Literature or BA/B.Sc. with 50% of marks or equivalent CGPA/GPA for Part II /Common Course -2 (Malayalam).

Note: Candidates applying for the course under the language stream with a bachelors degree in the subject concerned will be ranked first in that particular stream. Candidates applying for the course under any language stream based on Part I/Part II or common courses at undergraduate level and having PG Degree in the same subject as in Part I/ Part II will be ranked after that.

(iii) For Other Optional Subject

- a) **Mathematics:** B.Sc Degree with Mathematics/ Statistics/ Applied Statistics as main, with 50% marks or equivalent CGPA/GPA in part I +II+III together (Common, Complementary and Open Courses) or part III (Core and Complimentary Courses) alone or 50% marks in M.Sc. Mathematics/ Statistics/ Applied Statistics. Candidates with Statistics should have studied Mathematics as one of the subjects.
- (b) **Physical Science:** B.Sc. Degree with Physics/ Chemistry/ Polymer Chemistry/ Geology/ Petrochemicals/ Bio Chemistry/ Industrial Chemistry main with 50% marks or equivalent

CGPA/GPA in Part I + II + III + together (Common, Complementary and Open Courses) or Part III (Core and Complimentary Courses) alone or 50% marks in M.Sc. Physics/Chemistry/ Polymer Chemistry/ Geology/ Petrochemicals/ Bio Chemistry/ Industrial Chemistry/ Photonics (Integrated from CUSAT).

- (c) **Natural Science:** B.Sc. Degree with Botany/ Zoology/ Biochemistry/ B.Sc. Plant Science / Home Science with Zoology or Botany as subsidiary/ Aquaculture (with Biochemistry and Zoology as subsidiary) Forestry and wood technology/ Bio technology/ Microbiology with 50% marks or equivalent CGPA/ GPA in Part I+II+III together (Common, Complimentary and Open Courses) or Part III (Core and Complimentary Courses) alone or 50% marks in M.Sc. Botany/ Zoology/ Biochemistry/ Plant Science/ Home Science. They Should have studied Zoology/ Botany/ Bio Chemistry as one of the subjects in Degree Level.
- (d) **Social Science:** BA Degree with History/Arabic and Islamic History/ Urdu and Islamic History/ Geography/ Political Scienc/ Economics/ Sociology/ Psychology/ Philosophy/ West Asian Studies with 50% marks or equivalent CGPA/GPA in Part I+II+III together (Common, Core Complimentary and Open Courses) or Part III alone or 50% marks in MA History/ Arabic and Islamic History/ Geography/ Political Science/ Economics/ Sociology/ Psychology/ Philosophy/ West Asian Studies.

6. Selection Criteria

- a) Selection is based on the marks/ grade obtained by the applicant in the Degree Examination for Part III/ Core and Complimentary Courses or Part I/ Part II common courses as the case may be.
- b) Special weightage will be given to post graduate, in the same subject concerned as shown below.

- c) Weightage of 5 points/ marks will be given to candidates who have taken degree from Kannur University. A weightage of five index points will be given to the natives of Kannur University jurisdiction (i.e., Kannur, Kasaragod Revenue Districts and Mananthavady Taluk of Wayanad Revenue District) for admission to B.Ed. course in all institutions maintained by or affiliated to the University on production of nativity Certificate of 5 years issued by the Competent Revenue Authority.
- d) Those who have undergone NCC Training with minimum 75% attendance as stipulated in GO 673/04/HEDN, dated 15-04-1994 will be given an additional 5 marks: This will be added to the marks obtained by the candidate for Part III/Core and Complimentary courses. Eligible weightage will be given to NCC ABC certificate holders.

e) In the case applicants with double main triple main subjects admission will be based on the total of all main subjects and weightage will be given only on the subjects which the applicant applies as optional.

7. Illustration

The procedure to calculate CGPA of core and complementary courses together on the basis of Grade card issued by Kannur University from 2009 admission onwards illustrated through the example below.

CGPA = 259.68/78 = 3.333

Hence percentage of marks = $3.33 \times 25 = 83.25$

8. Reservation of Seats

9. How to Apply

- a) Candidates should attach Self attested copies of the Following Certificates/ Documents along with the application (these should be produced in original at the time of admission).
- i) Secondary School Leaving Certificate
- ii) Qualifying Degree Certificate and of higher qualifications, if any.
- iii) Mark Lists of qualifying Degree Examination/ Grade Card (All Semester/ Year with cumulative Grade Card) and of higher qualifications, if any.
- iv) Transfer Certificates and Conduct Certificate. (obtained within six months)
- v) Nativity/ Income/ Community/ Medical for those who claim weightage for admission or reservation benefit.

- vi) Equivalence/ Eligibility certificates from Kannur University in the case of double or triple main candidates and degree holders of universities outside Kerala.
- vii) Medical Fitness Certificate
- viii) Any other certificates from the competent authorities for the claim of weightage applicable.

If any of these certificates is not produced, the principal of the college has the right to summarily reject the claim for admission.

- b). Candidates provisionally selected should produce their original documents at the time of interview. The admission will be treated as final only after verification of the necessary original documents by the principal.
- c). The list of provisionally selected candidates will be published on Kannur University website. The provisionally selected candidates will be required to appear for an interview at the college. They are expected to pay the course fee as prescribed by the Govt./ University and submit all the original documents if they are finally selected. The colleges will not be responsible for non-receipt of communications due to postal delay. Applicants are required to verify the date of interview which will be intimated from the college. Candidates who do not report in time will forfeit all claims for admission.
- d). Reservation of seats and relaxation in marks will be as prescribed by the Govt./ University/ applicable to minority Institution.
- e). Date of publication of the Rank list, Admission, Commencement of Classes etc will be as prescribed by the university.

The following certificates in original have to be produced at the time of admission, along with the interview memo.

- 1. Secondary School Leaving Certificate
- 2. T.C. and Conduct Certificate from the institution last attended.
- 3. Degree/Diploma/Provisional certificate of the qualifying examination.
- 4. Mark lists of qualifying examination.
- 5. Certificate of Income, community, nativity wherever necessary.
- 6. Medical fitness certificate
- 7. Candidates belongs to Knanaya Catholic Community (Catholic Diocese of Kottayam) should bring character certificate from the parish priest.

- 8. If any of these documents is not produced, the Principal has the right to summarily reject the claim for admission.
- 9. Any other item not specifically covered in this Prospectus will be decided by the Principal and the decision shall be final.

NB: Admission will be made subject to the conditions of NCTE/ Govt/ University
