The man finally hit the stage amidst roaring applause, clad in a pristine white shirt, jet black trousers and the sprucest of blazers. He dwelled upon the necessity of dissent and healthy debate in a democracy especially in times of division and polarisation.



Tarun glowed with gratification as the seasoned politician commended the conviction with which the nation's youth took to the streets to safeguard the core tenets of the Constitution. He too cracked up as did most of the audience when Mr. Sibal targeted the present regime with some hard hitting sarcasm.

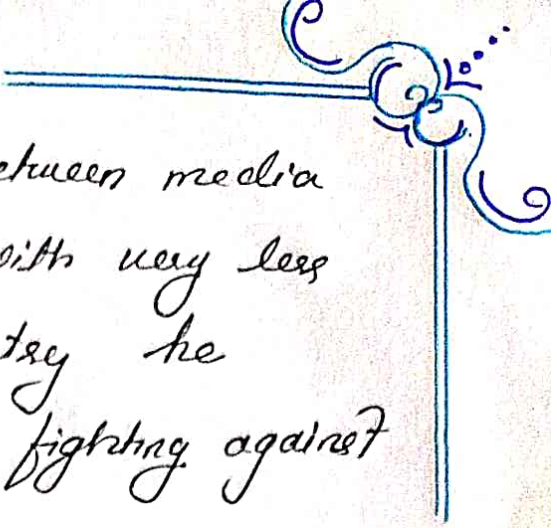
He felt the rare sense of contentment settling in as Mr. Sibal wrapped up his talk and tuned into the questions from the audience.

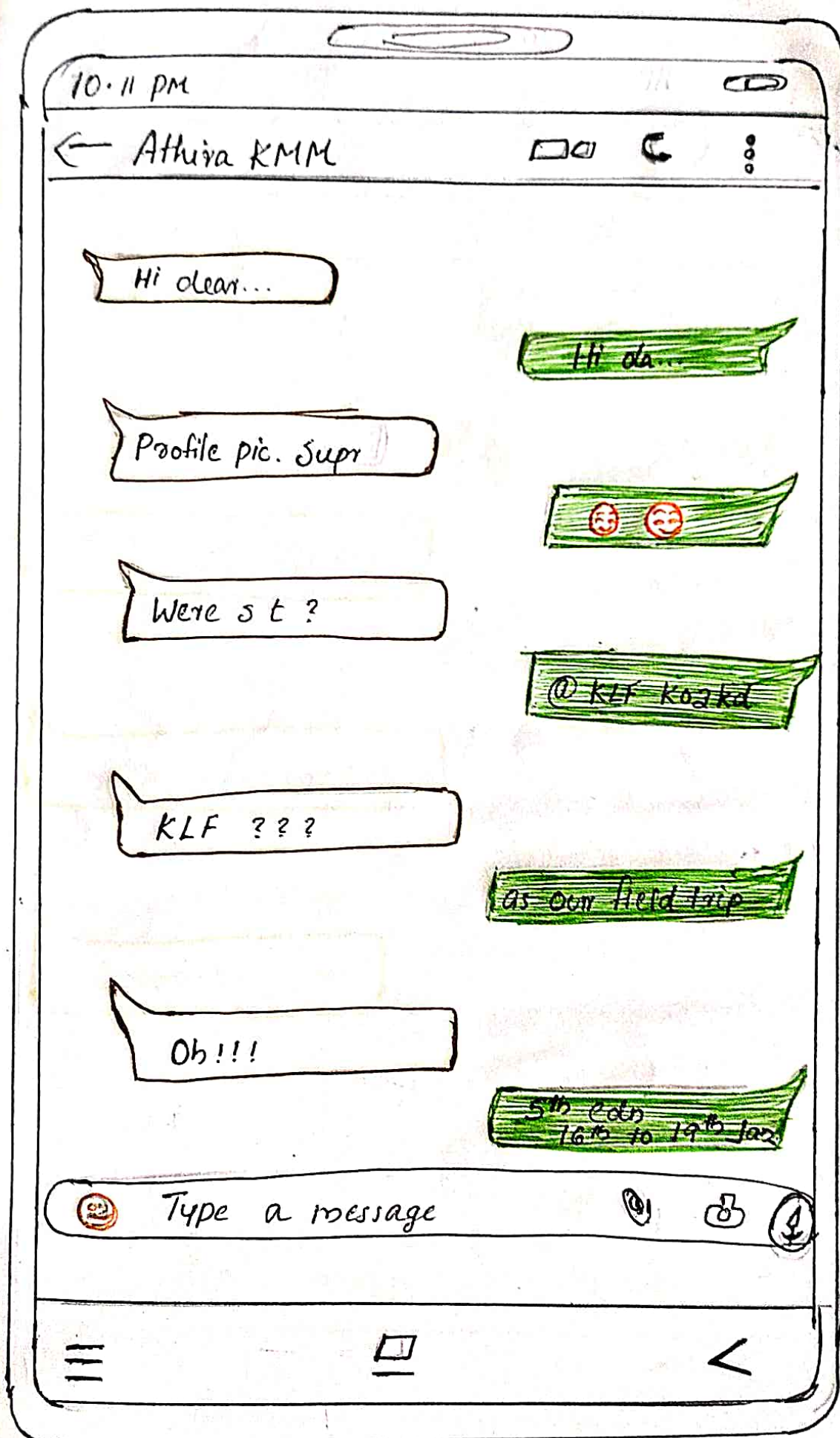
"The rulers of India have no idea of history but only of the experiment that they did in Gujarat", said Kapil Sibal, at the KLF. He was in conversation with John Brittas remarking on the current socio-political situation of the country. Understanding the constitution was crucial in the current scenario. Mr Sibal put forward his perceptual optimism in saying that we ought to believe in hope and come together politically to protect the idea of India. Referring to the anti CAA campaign, he opined that the recent protests is not a part of any political agenda but rather due to the lack of future they see here for themselves. He said that the current government who won the elections by selling dreams to the poor and the hopeless later focussed only on his personal development and abandoned the country. Talking about media, he held the opinion that we ought to come with a better



model in which the relation between media and industry is dismantled. With very less equality prevailing in the country he underscored the importance of fighting against the state sponsored communalism.

"We should give equal emphasis for education in politics and have to see that the army or police maintains ideological neutrality", said Mr Sibal. Stating that three among the four wheels of democracy are dysfunctional today he also shared his hope that the leader to replace Modi should emerge from the people.
