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
REPORT OF THE FEEDBACKS ON CURRICULUM BY PRACTICE TEACHING SCHOOLS

Curriculum equipping trainees to discharge duties	76	24




Of all the school managements, 76 percent opined that the curriculum equipped the trainees to carry out their duties effectively and 24 percent opined it did not.

Enhancement of learning experiences of students	81	19




81 percent of the school managements opined that the curriculum enhanced the learning experiences of the students. 19 percent of the school managements opined it did not.

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
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According to 78 percent of the school managements the curriculum did align with the needs of the school students. But 22 percent school managements opined it did not.

4. Does the objectives of the internship is clearly communicated?





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





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According to 65 percent of the school managements the effectiveness of the curriculum in preparing student teachers for internship was of satisfactory level. In the opinion of 25 percent school managements it was good and 10 percent school managements opined it to be excellent.

FINDINGS

In order to understand the opinions of the school managements, to which student-teachers were send for their internship, on the performance of the student teachers as well as the curriculum they studied feedbacks were collected. Of all the school managements, 76 percent opined that the curriculum equipped the trainees to carry out their duties effectively. 81 percent of the school managements opined that the curriculum enhanced the learning experiences of the students. 78 percent of the school managements acknowledged that the curriculum did align with the needs of the school students. Overall there was a satisfactory level of performance by the student teachers in the schools allotted to them. Also there was enough effectiveness for the curriculum in molding up the prospective teaches.
