


Interaction with Eminent Persons




Ventel Institutional Workshop



Overall the programme was well organized and the programme was summed up by the student coordinator Athira Shaji with the vote of thanks.








Lap Top for All


Film Screening and Visit to Tribal Settlement in Wayanad
